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Conditions of Use Policy:

- 1. For Girlguiding members, the use of the campsites and main field must be under the supervision of the appropriate number of adult leaders (over 18yrs) in accordance with GGUK policies on residential events or activities.
- 2. All leaders of groups or units using any aspect of the site must follow the Conditions of Use Policy, Site Rules and the guidance set out below.
- 3. Users other than Girlguiding should ensure they comply with their own activity / residential policy requirements of their organisation. You must ensure you have on site at all times enough adults to ensure the proper supervision and safety of all under 18's.
- 4. Non-Girlguiding users must also complete and submit at the time of booking the Hadlow Fields Hirer's Agreement Form.
- 5. All users agree to comply with the Hadlow Fields Site Rules Policy and any failure to comply with these rules will result in users being asked to leave the site and future site bookings will be cancelled. Quiet hours on site are from 10pm until 7am.
- 6. All users are expected to show consideration to other site users and our neighbours when arriving / leaving the site and in carrying out on site activities. All activities to be carried out on site during the period of your stay must be listed on the Hadlow Booking Form. Activities should be confined to the site booked unless by prior agreement.
- 7. The use of amplified music and activities involving shooting or motorised vehicles are not permitted.
- 8. The use of Orchard is only permitted for archery under the supervision of a Girlguiding Wirral Archery Instructor or qualified GB Archery instructor. No other use is permitted.
- 9. Any users wishing to use on site equipment (excluding the Adventure Playground & Traversing Wall) or our outdoor spaces (Fairy Trail, Outdoor Classroom, Outdoor Kitchen) should complete the appropriate booking form and submit it at the time of booking. This also applies to users who have booked to stay in the cottage.
- 10. All users are expected to leave their campsite, shelter, fire circle and all associated equipment including the alter fire / fridge & freezer in a clean and tidy condition at the end of their stay. Information on cleaning the toilet block and rubbish disposal can be found on the Site Users Information notice board in each shelter and the main site notice board on the Gate House.
- 11. Unit / Group leaders are responsible for having a Fire Evacuation List of persons staying and to have conducted a fire drill before the first night of the stay.
- 12. Unit / Group leader are expected to have with them a first aid kit adequate for their needs and competent adult first aiders.

Injury to person from a moving vehicle	All Users	 5mph signs on the driveway approaching the car park and speed limiter ramps. No Parking signs in use on key gates to allow emergency access. Group leaders should accompany under 16's if they need to access the car park or driveway. The main gate from the car park to the camping field should be kept closed. Vehicles are not permitted on the camping fields. Limited vehicle parking on the main field for events can be agreed in advance with Site Service and a risk assessment drawn up. Vehicle access to the rear of the cottage is permitted for loading / unloading only. Where the field is in use drivers should have their hazard lights on and not exceed 5mph. Once unloaded the vehicle must be moved back to the car park. All vehicles should be parked in a way to maximise use of the car park for all users. Electrocution from electricity supply or onsite appliances (Icehouse & Toilet Block)	All Users	 Safety Data sheets for cleaning products and hand soap is in the main cleaning cupboard. The toilet block should be cleaned under adult supervision. Portable appliance testing of electrical items is conducted on a risk-based approach with high-risk items checked annually. Devices are labelled with their last inspection date. Electrical fixed wiring throughout the site is subject is inspected and testing by an approved person on a five-year programme in accordance with current legal requirements. Electrocution / risk of electrical fire from electrical portable devices brought in by site users	All Users	 Cheshire Fire & Rescue have advised that portable charging devices or mobile phones pose a risk of fire when stored in clothing, bags or in tents. Charging of a leader's emergency contact mobile phone can be carried out in the Icehouse if necessary. Charging must only be carried out during the day; charging must not be carried out overnight. No other electrical devices should be charged. Any electric items brought to site must have been tested to the appropriate safety standard within the last 12 months. A copy of the certificate of test should be with the item when on site. This excludes mobile phones. Fire risk from open fires and gas appliances	All Users	 Group/Unit Camp Leader to have a suitable audible method of raising the alarm in the event of an expected fire. In the event of a grass fire, fire at the woodpile or tent fire the Fire Service must be call on 999. A leader should go to the bottom of the drive to mark the site entrance. 		 A fire drill must be carried out with all users prior to the first night of the stay. The site Muster Point is inside orchard farthest away from the cottage and is clearly marked with a green muster point sign. Group/Unit Camp Leader should have available fire blankets and water buckets where open fires or gas cooking is being used. 		Group leader to conduct a fire drill.		
		 Campfire circles should only be used under adult supervision. Fires should be contained to the center of the bricked / soil area. Fires must not be of a size that would reach the surrounding grass area or cause any damage to surrounding grass or trees. Woodpiles must be at least 3m away from any campfire. 		 Cooking stoves must not be used immediate adjacent to any sleeping tents. Cheshire Fire & Rescue advise where a tent is used for cooking it should be positioned 6m away from any other tent. There should be a fire blanket and or extinguisher in the tent in case of emergency. All cooking appliances must be positions away from walls or roof of the tent. Gas leak from the LPG tank, pipework, or gas appliance (toilet block boiler)	All Users	 closed then 2m to each other. 

Falling branches from trees	Users	 The wooded area adjacent to the car park is out of bounds to all site users. Trees are subject to a detailed three-yearly tree survey and an annual visual review by a qualified person. All trees are managed in accordance with our tree risk assessment. Site users are expected to take extra care during periods of extreme weather, which can adversely affect the stability of a tree. Group /Unit leaders must ensure tents are not directly pitched under trees with large bows as trees can unexpectedly drop branches especially in the summer. There are newly planted young trees across the site, users must avoid carrying out activities close to them to prevent any damage. Tree climbing is not permitted on the site. 		Group leader to report to the warden any damaged / diseased trees. Group leader to monitor weather conditions while on site and take action as required. Group leaders to ensure this does not happen. Insect or wildlife problems linked to waste & rubbish	Users	 Commercial bins are provided at the bottom of the driveway (rubbish & recycling). Dustbins are provided in each campsite shelter, but site users should ensure bin bags are used. Bins should be emptied and cleaned at the end of each stay. Neither rubbish bags nor food waste should be stored on the campsite due to the fire risk / vermin risk this poses - all rubbish to be taken to the main site bins.
